ORDINANCE NO. 100

AN ORDINANCE RESTRICTING THE USE OF MOTORCYCLES,
MOTOR BIKES, TRAIL BIKES, GO-CARTS, MOTOR SCOOTERS
AND SNOW MOBILES ON PRIVATE OR PUBLIC PROPERTY
WITHIN WHITE TOWNSHIP AND PROVIDING PENALTIES IN
CERTAIN CASES.

WHEREAS, the operation of motorcycles, motor bikes, trail bikes, motor scooters, go-carts and snowmobiles upon private or public property is, in certain cases, a private trespass, a private and a public nuisance and an invasion of privacy; and

WHEREAS, the operation of such vehicles upon private or public property has created hazards to the health, safety and welfare of such operators and the residents of White Township, and

WHEREAS, the operation of such vehicles upon such private or public property generally disturbs the peace and denies the right of quiet enjoyment to the residents on adjoining property.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Supervisors of the Township of White, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by virtue of the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION I. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any motorcycle, motor bike, trail bike, motor scooter, go-cart or snowmobile upon private property of the operator within two hundred (200) feet of the neighboring property line unless consent to the operation is obtained as hereinafter set forth and filed with the Secretary of the Township.

SECTION II. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any motorcycle, motor bike, trail bike, motor scooter, go-cart or snowmobile upon private property other than the private property of the operator of such vehicle unless the prior written permission of the owner of such property and prior written permission of any neighboring property owner within two hundred (200) feet of

said operation has been obtained by such operator and filed with the Secretary of the Township.

SECTION III. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any motorcycle, motor bike, trail bike, motor scooter, go-cart, or snowmobile upon public property unless prior written permission has been obtained by such operator from White Township and filed with the Secretary of the Township. Also, in such case, if the operation of said vehicle on public property shall be within two hundred (200) feet of the neighboring private property line, the consent of the private property owner must be obtained in the manner set forth in Section IV, herein.

SECTION IV. Consent of the owners of the property upon which the vehicle is being operated or the consent of the owners of the property within the two hundred (200) feet limitation aforesaid shall be made on a form prescribed by and available from and filed within the Township through the Township Secretary. For this purpose, "owners" shall include "lessee."

The consent shall be for such period of time as set forth therein, but in no event, for a greater period than seven (7) days.

SECTION V. This ordinance shall not apply to any of the aforesaid vehicles if they are duly licensed by the State of Pennsylvania for operation on the roadways of Pennsylvania and so long as they are operated on a roadway, driveway or other form of vehicle access way that is used for the normal flow of traffic or access to a garage, parking lot or other place of storage or parking of licensed vehicles.

SECTION VI. Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a summary offense and upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), nor more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), or be imprisoned for not more than ninety (90) days or both.

SECTION VII. Should any Section, paragraph, sentence or word of this Ordinance be declared, for any reason, to be invalid or unconstitutional or incapable of enforcement, it is the intent of the Supervisors of the Township of White, that it would have passed and enacted all other portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION VIII. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage.
