

ORDINANCE NO. 111

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WHITE,  
COUNTY OF BEAVER, THE COMMONWEALTH OF  
PENNSYLVANIA, PROHIBITING THE STORING  
OF INOPERATIVE OR UNLICENSED VEHICLES  
AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION  
OF THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of  
the Township of White, Beaver County, Pennsylvanmia, and it is  
hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same.


SECTION 1. No person shall store or permit to be stored  
on any lot or presises a motor vehicle which is dismantled,  
inoperative or unlicensed for a period of more than ten (10)  
days unless the same is kept or stored in a completely enclosed  
authorized and permitted building or garage on such lot or  
premises. Any such motor vehicle shall be deemed inoperative  
when the lack or failure of the engine, transmission or other  
mechanical part renders the vehicle unusable for transportation  
of persons. The police department is authorized to serve  
written notice on property owners or persons in possession of  
any such lot or land upon which an unlicensed or inoperative  
motor vehicle is stored contrary to the provisions hereof.  
Such period of ten (10) days shall commence the day following  
the service of such notice. No person who has been so notified  
or who is the owner of or is in charge or possession of any lot  
or land which such vehicle is stored shall fail to remove the  
same after such notice.

SECTION 2. Whoever violates or fails to comply with any  
provisions of this Ordinance, shall be fined not less than  
Seventy Five (\$75.00) Dollars and not more than Three Hundred  
(\$300.00) Dollars and the costs of prosecution thereof in the  
manner provided by the Second Class Township Code and upon  
failure to pay said fine and costs shall be committed to jail  
as provided by the Second Class Township Code. The seperate  
offense shall be deemed committed each day during or on which  
a violation or non-compliance occurs or continues.

SECTON 3. Any ordinance or part thereof conflicting with  
this ordinance is hereby repealed insofar as the same is  
inconsistent herewith.
