

ORDINANCE NO. 45

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WHITE, BEAVER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, VACATING A PORTION OF A CERTAIN ALLEY LYING BETWEEN ELEVENTH AVENUE (FORMERLY FIRST AVENUE) AND TWELFTH AVENUE (FORMERLY SECOND AVENUE) AND EXTENDING NORTH FROM TWENTY-SIXTH STREET AND REVOKING INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Supervisors of the Township of White, Beaver County, Pennsylvania, under and by virtue of the authority contained in the Second Class Township Code, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows :

SECTION I. The following described portion of that certain alley hereinafter described is hereby vacated :

All that certain piece or parcel of land situate in the Township of White, County of Beaver and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, being a portion of a certain alley situate in the William Ward Plan of Lots in said Township, as the said Plan is recorded in the Office of the Recorder of Deeds in and for Beaver County, Pennsylvania, in Plan Book, Vol.1, page 3, and bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point of intersection of the northerly line of Twenty-sixth Street and the easterly line of First Alley; thence northwardly by the westerly line of Lots 1,2,3,4,5 and 6 in the said Plan, a distance of 220.6 feet to a point at the dividing line between Lots 6 and 7 in the said Plan; thence westwardly, crossing the said alley, a distance of 15 feet to a point on the westerly line of the said alley, at the dividing line between Lots 15 and 16 in the said Plan; thence by the said westerly line of the said alley, southwardly, 213 feet by the easterly lines of Lots 12,13,14 and 15 to a point on the said northerly line of Twenty-sixth Street; thence by the said northerly line of Twenty-sixth Street, eastwardly, to a point, at the place of beginning.

SECTION II. Any and all Ordinances inconsistent herewith heretofore adopted are hereby repealed insofar as such Ordinances are inconsistent with this Ordinance.
