

**MEETING OF THE SUPERVISORS  
WHITE TOWNSHIP  
April 7, 2021**

On Wednesday, April 7, 2021 in the Meeting Room of the Township Building, located at 2511 13<sup>th</sup> Ave. in White Township, PA 15010, the Regular Monthly Meeting was called to order at approximately 7:00PM by Supervisor DeMeio.

**Reports:**

**Earned Income Tax:** Supervisor DeMeio read that \$8,791.47 was collected in March.

**Real Estate Tax & Fire Protection Fee:** Nancy Munroe read \$37,343.59 was collected for Real Estate & \$140.00 in Fire Protection Fees in March.

**Accounts Payable & Payroll Summary:** AP = \$37,934.04 / PR = \$13,650.90

**Police:** Chief Stanislawski read there were 142 calls (traffic monitoring is included) for service in March, resulting in 1 arrest for Terroristic Threats and 6 traffic citations.

**Code Enforcement:** Dan Burns read in the month of March there were 6 new notices of violation; 3 abatements; 1 hearing postponed until 4/8/21; 2 Stop Work orders posted.

**Fire Department:** Supervisor Evans said there were 3 calls for service in March: Fire Alarm on 26<sup>th</sup> Ave. (5FF) call was cancelled; 3/17: MVA in West Mayfield (4FF) call was rerouted; 3/19: Downed power line on 21<sup>st</sup> Ave. (2FF/2MH).

**Road Crew:** Tom Orłowski said they've been approached by residents complaining of issues that aren't the road crew's responsibility. It's either a zoning matter or a code matter or a police matter.

**Correspondence:**

1. The Beaver County Conservation District is conducting mosquito surveillance throughout the County from May to October. The mosquito traps are usually set for 24 hours & are clearly marked with identification. If you have questions or would like to learn more please call 724-378-1701.

**Unfinished Business:**

1. (From March 2021) The Stucky/Crawford request for zoning variance. They need to further review Ordinance 113, which addresses the questions they have, provide an updated site map, and put the request in writing including the specific section of Ordinance 113 for which they are seeking the variance. The Supervisors all agreed to table this topic until Stucky &/or Crawford provide these articles.

### **New Business:**

1. Chief Johnson of the BFPD was present to discuss what they can offer White Twp. in terms of police service. Supervisor DeMeio said if the BOS decides to open the discussion of changing police coverage, the discussions wouldn't happen until a few months from now.
2. Two sewer lines will need jetted very soon. 12<sup>th</sup> /23<sup>rd</sup> St. in Mt. Washington AND 26<sup>th</sup> St. Ext. Road crew also mentioned Craighead/Burgess. The Supervisors all agree to have the road crew contact Robinson Pipe Cleaning to complete this service.

### **Good & Welfare of the Township:**

1. The hours for the clean fill dump are M-F 7:00am to 3:00pm and the road crew would appreciate notification by calling 724-462-1505 prior to dumping any clean fill.
2. The next Twp. Meeting will be on 5/5/21 at 7:00PM at the Twp. building.

### **Public Forum:**

1. Ron Miller of 28<sup>th</sup> St. said that he received a collection notice from Sharp Collections seeking delinquent Fire Fees from 2014 on. He said he never received a bill in the mail in any of those years and in speaking with Tax Collector Munroe about this it was realized that former Tax Collector, Lou Adrian didn't put him on the residential list, therefore, he asked the Board of Supervisors to waive the Twp.'s late fees. The Board all agreed to do so.
2. Ray Evans Sr. of 12<sup>th</sup> Ave. has a cancelled check to prove he paid the 2018 Fire Fee, yet he got a collection notice from Sharp Collections for the third year in a row about said fee. He urged Tax Collector Munroe to straighten it out for good.
3. Dan Swartz of 27<sup>th</sup> St. thanked the PTPD and also had questions and suggestions about the Twp.'s insurance.
