MEETING OF THE SUPERVISORS

August 4, 2021

On Wednesday, August 4, 2021 in the Meeting Room of the Township Building, located at 2511 13th Ave. in White Township, PA 15010, the Regular Monthly Meeting was called to order at approximately 7:00PM by Supervisor DeMeio.

This Meeting was advertised in the *Beaver County Times* on January 7, 2021 in accordance with the Sunshine Law, Section 709.

Supervisor DeMeio made a motion to approve the minutes of the July 7, 2021 Regular Meeting. Supervisor Lavery seconded. Supervisor DeMeio – YES. Supervisor Evans – YES. Supervisor Lavery – YES. Motion carried.

Public Forum:

1. Amber Djan of Short 10th Ave. spoke about the roads in Mt. Washington, the overgrown trees in the R-O-W, the vacant houses in her neighborhood.

2. PA State Representative, Jim Marshall said he's been in contact with PENNDOT about improving Clayton Rd. He also urged the Twp. to apply for as many grants as possible for roadway paving throughout the Twp.

Reports:

Earned Income Tax: Supervisor DeMeio read that \$2,378.00 was collected in July.

Real Estate Tax & Fire Protection Fee: Supervisor DeMeio read \$543.83 was collected for Real Estate & \$350.00 in Fire Protection Fees in July.

Accounts Payable & Payroll Summary: AP = \$43,187.60 / PR = \$10,663.03

Police: Chief Stanislawski read there were 116 calls (traffic monitoring is included) for service in July, resulting in 13 traffic citations; 2 traffic warnings; 3 arrests (Simple Assault, Disorderly Conduct, Dogs Running at Large). Asked the Twp. to send a letter to the home of the dogs running at large, as it's their 3rd occurrence per Ordinance No. 138.

Code Enforcement: Dan Burns read in the month of July there were 2 new property violation notices; 7 abatements; 6 citations issued.

Fire Department: Supervisor Evans read there were 8 call for service in July: On 7/3: Structure Fire on Craighead (4FF/6MHrs.); 7/12: Gas smell on Steffin Hill (4FF/2MHrs.); 7/13: Medical Assist in West Mayfield (6FF/6MHrs.); 7/16: Structure Fire on 24th Ave. (4FF/1Mhr.); 7/17: Fire Alarm on Craighead (4FF/1Mhr.); 7/17: Structure Fire at Colonial Oaks (5FF/10MHrs.); 7/21: Fire Alarm on Clayton Rd. (3FF/.75MHrs.); 7/26: Vehicle Fire on Steffin Hill (4FF/4MHrs.).

Road Crew: Tom Orłowski talked about the broken picnic table bench at the playground. The Supervisors instructed him to get prices for a replacement. Spoke of a driver doing 'donuts' in the playground; how he (Tom) will convey the monetary value in damages to Assistant Chief Bathgate, in order to file for restitution. The Supervisors discussed possibly placing a gate, or a cable, or a chain to prevent future occurrences. No decision was made.

2. The 12th Ave. bridge grant: *Supervisor DeMeio made a motion to approve the Agreement between the Twp. & PENDOT for the 12th Ave bridge grant. Supervisor Lavery seconded. Supervisor DeMeio – YES. Supervisor Evans – YES. Supervisor Lavery – YES. Motion carried.*
3. The Dye Test Ordinance detail discussion was tabled for this month as no one from LSSE was present nor was the 3rd draft of the ordinance submitted for the Board's review.

New Business:

1. Road crew has an estimate from Meiters for a replacement hydraulic spinner motor for the pickup's spreader for \$385.13. The Supervisors all agree to this purchase.
